

The Nativity of John the Baptist Monday, June 24, 2024 8:00 a.m. (ET)

Celebrate the birth of St. John the Baptist for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass at Our Lady of the Angels Chapel in Irondale, Alabama.

Birth of St. John the Baptist (June 24)

The feast of the Nativity, or birthday, of St. John the Baptist, the precursor of the Messiah and born six months before Him, is observed on June 24, and is one of the oldest feasts in the liturgy of the Church. He was the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth, a cousin of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Tradition places the home and birthplace of the Baptist near the village of Ain-Karim, six miles west of Jerusalem, where a Franciscan church marks the site. The church is called "St. John in the Mountains."

What we know of this saint, than whom a greater prophet had not arisen, from his sanctification before his birth to his martyrdom under King Herod, is set down in Holy Scripture. He has always had a chief place in the veneration given by holy Church to the heroic servants of God. While the feast of other Saints is celebrated on the day of their death, when their final victory is won, the birthday of St. John the Baptist is his feast day, as he was *born* free from original sin. We have also the feast of the Birth of Mary Immaculate.

Thirty years after the birth of Jesus, John began his mission on the banks of the Jordan. He was the last of the prophets of the Old Covenant. His work was to prepare the way and announce the coming of the long-expected messiah, the Redeemer, in Whom all flesh would see "the salvation of God."

Before St. John was born, an angel announced that "many would rejoice in his birth," and so June 24 is ranked among the joyous feasts of the year. In former times, and in other lands, it was observed with greater holiday rejoicing and greater outward display than in our age. On the eve of St. John's day "St. John's fires" were lighted on the hills and mountains in many countries, as they are still lighted in some places. "Scarce had the last rays of the setting sun died away, when all the world over, immense columns of flame arose from every mountain top, and in an instant every town and village and hamlet was lighted up."

St. Cyril of Alexandria

Bishop of Alexandria & Doctor of the Church Feast Day: June 27 Patron Saint of Magistrates

Faith brings unity, and unity establishes peace. The life and contributions of Cyril of Alexandria embody these very principles.

Cyril was born in Egypt in 376. As a boy, he was trained in a monastery, and later he studied theology and the classics in Alexandria. His uncle Theophilus, the patriarch of Alexandria and a man known for his harsh and rigid temperament, ordained Cyril at the turn of the fifth century. Cyril succeeded Theophilus in 412. According to historians, Cyril seemed to inherit his uncle's inflexible nature.

At the time of Cyril's rule, Alexandria was overrun with violence and intolerance. Cyril exerted his considerable power over any group that disputed the orthodox beliefs of the Church. He closed down the churches of the Novations, a sect that opposed the doctrine of forgiveness, and Cyril also drove out the Jews, who were killing Christians.

Cyril became a champion of the Church in his debate with Nestorius, the Archbishop of Constantinople. Nestorius taught that Christ had two distinct natures, human and divine. According to him, Mary had given birth to a man and could not be called *Theotokos*, the Greek word for "Godbearing." Cyril argued, with great wisdom and logic, that this heresy threatened the doctrine of Incarnation. They both presented their cases to the Pope. Cyril was victorious, and Nestorius was condemned and excommunicated. For the next few years, Cyril worked to reconcile Nestorius's followers with the Church.

A brilliant theologian who restored Mary to her rightful place of honor. Cyril helped clarify the doctrine of Incarnation, which is still held by the Church today. He was named a Doctor of the Church in 1882.
