Miraculous Medal Annual Enrollment

Every year our parish participates in the Annual Enrollment of the Miraculous Medal from November 14th to November 30th.

Those wishing to participate in the Novena (9 days) to the Miraculous Mary, may obtain a Novena Card in the back of the church on the table. Novena begins on Nov.18th & ends on Nov. 26th.



Annual Enrollment Book

Anyone may enroll in the Association of the Miraculous Medal, including yourself, any age, for any living or deceased person (s), Catholics or non Catholics. The enrollment book and all donations are sent to the Association of the Miraculous Medal after Christmas. You may enroll from Nov. 14 to Nov. 30.

The Blessed Mother appeared to (now), St. Catherine Labore, and on Nov. 27, 1830, she revealed to her the design of the medal and the prayer "O Mary conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee!" St. Catherine's Feast day is November 28th.

Learn more about the medal of the Immaculate Conception, popularly known as the miraculous medal, designed by the Blessed Virgin herself. Blessed Medals, Novena Cards, and Brochures will be available on the table in the back of the church.

St. Charles Borromeo November 4 Patron Saint of Bishops, Cardinals, Seminarians & Spiritual Leaders

On October 2, 1538, Charles Borromeo was born to a noble family in the castle at Arona on Lake Maggiore in northern Italy. Charles received his basic education from the Benedictines and went on to earn a doctorate in civil and canon law in 1559. That same year, his uncle became Pope Pius IV.

The new Pope made 22-year-old Charles a cardinal, although he was not yet a priest, as well as administrator of the archdiocese of Milan. However, before Charles could go to Milan, he was also given several other Church positions, including one that made him, in effect, the Pope's secretary of state. Because of his numerous responsibilities, Charles was forced to let auxiliaries run the Milan archdiocese, which covered much of Italy and most of Switzerland.

Charles was the force behind the Council of Trent's final session in 1562, and he personally drafted the council's catechism. Finally, in 1563, he was ordained a priest and bishop.

After Pope Pius IV died in 1566, Charles went to Milan to initiate the Council of Trent's reforms in his archdiocese, where he founded seminaries that became models for others. He also set up a Confraternity of Christian Doctrine through which thousands of catechists taught children in Sunday schools.

Charles traveled throughout his archdiocese, teaching and preaching—despite a speech impediment. In tumultuous times riddled with the devastating effects of famine and plague, he saw to it that the people were fed and cared for at whatever cost, ignoring the mounting serious debts. But Charles wore himself out with work and died in 1584 at the age of 46.
